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National Curriculum Requirements for Swimming and water safety

90% Year 6 pupils could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
28% Year 6 pupils could use a range of strokes effectively
96% Year 6 pupils could perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
28% Year 6 pupils achieved all three national curriculum statements
